



A COURSE INTO

DISCIPLESHIP

TO BE AN APOSTLE/DISCIPLE OF YAHSAH, ONE WILL NEED TO HAVE THE ACCURATE KNOWLEDGE OF TRUTH.

There are many organisations that have some sort of discipleship. Mostly, these organisations that have disciples are of the religious types. One would associate a true disciple as one belonging to the Messiah, because the Messiah is the Anointed of YHWH and also the Son of YHWH.

“So, He summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, in order to expel these and to cure every sort of disease and every sort of infirmity. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon, the one called Peter, and Andrew his brother; and James the son of Zebedee and John his brother; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean and Judas Iscariot, who later betrayed Him.” Matthew 10:1-4

In the Holy Scriptures Yahsah chose his 12 disciples. Those disciples already had a knowledge of the books of Moses and of the prophets, but Yahsah was about to teach them something far greater.

“When He saw the crowds, He went up into the mountain; and after He sat down His disciples came to Him; and He opened His mouth and began teaching them...” Matthew 5:1

You have to understand that Yahsah Messiah came from the realms above; that is to say from the heavenly places. So he had greater knowledge than any living person on the earth; the fact that He was part of the world's creation with his heavenly Father YHWH.

“So, He went on to say to them: “You are from the realms below; I am from the realms above. You are from this world; I am not from this world.” John 8:23

Many of the times that Yahsah spoke to His disciples, He spoke to them in parables or illustrations. On some occasions His disciples did not understand these parables; but on occasions Yahsah would give them the understanding. There were even times He spoke parables to the crowds, but the crowds had no idea what the Messiah was talking about. Remember that most of the crowds believed Yahsah was the Messiah, so they are hearing a speech they do not understand, but they did not approach the Messiah to ask for the understanding of the parables.

“In reply He said: “To you it is granted to understand the sacred secrets of the kingdom of the heavens; but to those people it is not granted.” Matthew 13:11

“This is why I speak to them by the use of parables; because, looking, they look in vain, and hearing, they hear in vain, neither do they get the sense of it; and toward them the prophecy of Isaiah is having fulfilment, which says, ‘By hearing, you will hear but by no means get the sense of it; and, looking, you will look but by no means see.’” Matthew 13:13-14

There were multitudes of people following the Messiah because He had words of hope and salvation. He spoke about love and a better future, and most of all, he performed miracles. He gave them a reason not to fear and gave them an opportunity to be free. At one point there was up to 5,000 people who literally followed him. Some of those were yet to become disciples of the Messiah.

“Well, on getting out, He saw a great crowd, but he was moved with pity for them, because they were as sheep without a shepherd. And he started to teach them many things...”

...and He took the five loaves and two fishes, and, looking up to heaven, He said a blessing and, after breaking the loaves, He distributed them to the disciples; the disciples in turn to the crowds... Yet those eating were about five thousand men, besides women and young children.” Matthew 6:14-21

The 12 disciples whom Yahsah chose did not question him when he said to them to be his followers; but just put down or left whatever they were doing and followed him. During His ministry He also spoke to others to be His follower; none of those refused but wanted to first go back to deal with whatever it was they had to do. It became a stumbling for them, because they failed to see the importance of following the Messiah than of the things behind, thus rendering Yahsah Messiah as second best to their things in life.

“...He called them. At once, leaving the boat and their father, they followed him. ...And he said to them: ‘Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.’ At once, abandoning the nets, they followed him.” Matthew 4:18-22

“I will follow you, Lord; but first permit me to say good-bye to those in my household.” Yahsah said to him: ‘No man that has put his hand to a plough and looks at the things behind is well fitted for the kingdom of God.’” Luke 9:61

Yahsah was teaching His disciples to become like him, to do as He does. In a round-a-bout sense, Yahsah was a disciple of His Father in the heavens. He often stated that the words He was speaking was not His own but were from the Father who gave them to Him. At another time He spoke and said to His own disciples that when they see Him they see the Father. He was expressing the term of, “Like Father, like Son.” He also spoke words about a pupil not being above his teacher, but those who are perfectly instructed will become just like his teacher.

“Yahsah said: ‘When once you have lifted up the Son of man, then you will know that I am He, and that I do nothing of My own initiative; but just as the Father taught me I speak these things.’” John 8:28

“A pupil is not above his teacher, but everyone that is perfectly instructed will be like his teacher.” Luke 6:40

The disciples of Yahsah spent over 3 years with Him during his ministry. They learnt from Him, and on some occasions were given instructions by Him. He sent them out by two's when He knew they were ready to follow His instructions based on what He taught them. There were also 70 other disciples whom He gave instructions to and sent them out to preach the Good News of the Kingdom of God. He gave to them power of authority to achieve their commission in His name.

“Then he called the twelve together and gave them power and authority over all the demons and to cure sicknesses. And so, He sent them forth to preach the Kingdom of God and to heal...” Luke 9:1-2

“After these things the Lord designated seventy others and sent them forth by twos in advance of Him into every city and place to which He himself was going to come. Then He began to say to them: ‘...and cure the sick ones in it, and go on telling them, ‘The kingdom of God has come near to you.’ Then the seventy returned with joy, saying: ‘Lord, even the demons are made subject to us by the use of your name.’” Luke 10:1-17

Before Yahsah Messiah left the earth after being crucified and raised up from the dead, He gave instructions to His disciples. These instructions were for them to go forth and make disciples of people of all the nations. That was his final instruction to them concerning their commission. He also stated that He will be with them all the days until the conclusion of the system of things.

“Go therefore and make disciples of people of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all the things I have commanded you. And, look! I am with you all the days until the conclusion of the system of things.” Matthew 28:19-20

There are some very important lessons to be learnt concerning discipleship. To be a disciple one would need to learn from the Scriptures the Word of God. It is not just simply believing in Yahsah and thinking that one should go out and teach, evangelise or preach.

It is a very common practice for many churches to send their members out without them having accurate knowledge of YHWH and His Son Yahsah. It is not a problem for them if their members they send out are not equipped with the accurate knowledge of God, but as long as they can bring as many people to their churches by means of information via leaflets or otherwise, then it will be more money for churches.

“This is fine and acceptable in the sight of our Saviour, God, whose will is that all sorts of men should be saved and come to an accurate knowledge of truth. For there is one God, and one Mediator between God and men, a Man, Messiah Yahsah, who gave Himself a corresponding ransom for all - this is what is to be witnessed to at its own particular times.” 1 Timothy 2:3-6 Ephesians 4:11-15

In today’s world there is much confusion concerning the truth pertaining to YHWH, and when the truth is being spoken by those ordained by Yahsah, in most cases it is not believed upon because of the inaccurate doctrines about Yahsah spoken by a high percentage of the churches. The world now is so twisted and crooked that it believes the lie instead of the truth. When the truth is being spoken, most of the religious organisations and people no longer recognise it.

“They have acted ruinously on their own part; they are not His children; the defect is their own. A generation crooked and twisted!” Deuteronomy 32:5

“For such men are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into apostles of Messiah. And no wonder, for Satan himself keeps transforming himself into an Angel of light.” 2 Corinthians 11:13-14
